








OUR AREAS OF IMPACT

Activities range from direct grant funding and assistance with access to grants, to the provision of community development loans and volunteering at qualifying organizations.

PARTNERING FOR A PURPOSE

As a member of the Federal Home Loan Bank San Francisco (FHLB), F&M Bank is able to offer access to funding that is used to produce or preserve affordable housing, facilitate sustainable homeownership, and boost economic development activity, helping to create opportunities for individuals and families, and build or strengthen communities. FHLB's grant programs for housing and economic development help close persistent resource gaps in the communities that we serve. Their various grant programs are offered throughout the year, and is another resource for our nonprofit clients to utilize in support of their mission.

2021 AHEAD GRANTS

FHLB's Access to Housing and Economic Assistance for Development (AHEAD) grants support our local nonprofits, agencies, and associations to get innovative jobs programs up and running or continue to provide vital social services in underserved communities.

In 2021, F&M Bank collaborated to obtain \$25,000 in grant funding from the AHEAD Program to support programs at Second Chance Orange County.

Awarded for their job training program, Second Chance Orange County provides job and life skills training to low-income clients recovering from drug and alcohol addictions, many of whom are homeless, formerly incarcerated, and/or living with mental and physical disabilities. This project will target clients in the underserved Southern Orange County area through a partnership with a local homeless shelter to provide job skills training and placement as well as outreach and training for potential employer partners. AHEAD will pay for staff and materials as well as incentives for clients.



2021 MATCHING FUNDS

In response to the unprecedented COVID-19 public health emergency and its devastating economic impact, FHLB offered matching funds for nonprofits and small businesses for pandemic relief and for assistance to nonprofits to support communities affected by natural disasters.

These matching funds helped to make F&M's donations to the below organizations go even further in their impact as the nonprofits continue to rebound from the past 2 years.

In 2021 the Foundation distributed \$448,581 to 104 deserving recipients. Education was the area of focus for 2021, with grants given

in the following areas of impact: all levels of schooling (elementary through university), organizations that support education through workforce development and internships, education programs for persons with disabilities, hands-on nature curriculum and after-school support programs.

The mission of the Foundation is to support and enhance the communities it serves by providing philanthropic support to qualifying organizations who provide impactful community benefits in the areas of faith-based initiatives, education, healthcare, human services, and the arts.

2021 MICRO/SMALL BUSINESS GRANT PROGRAM

In response to the escalating need for pandemic relief resources, F&M Bank committed \$40,000 in 2021 to support local micro or small businesses adversely impacted by COVID-19 who had been forced to make adjustments to stabilize the business while continuing to support the local community. 16 grant recipients were selected from 659 applicants by a Grants Selection Committee comprised of F&M Bank employees. Preference was given to businesses serving low to moderate income communities and/or those owned by a member of an underrepresented community. Being an F&M Bank client was not a requirement.

LONG BEACH COMMUNITY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

F&M Bank was the founding corporate sponsor for the Long Beach Community Internship Program (LBCIP) which connects CSULB Long Beach Promise students with local Long Beach nonprofits for transformative paid internship opportunities. This tight knit collaboration between education, the nonprofit sector, and corporations allows students to do meaningful work in their own neighborhoods, while they apply coursework to real world settings, hone professional skills, network, and explore local career options. DOWNTOWN LONG BEACH ALLIANCE PARTNERSHIP

F&M Bank partnered with the Downtown Long Beach Alliance (DLBA) to support its Small Business and Women-Owned Business Grant programs by committing \$90,000 over a three-year period as a Legacy Partner with DLBA. As a supporter of DLBA, we are dedicated to promoting economic inclusion by growing small businesses and cultivating entrepreneurs in our local economy.

Entrepreneur Education Series & Small Business Grant

To qualify for DLBA's Pitchfest, in its fourth year, business owners completed a series of modules over five weeks in the Entrepreneur and Small Business Education Series. The program is a partnership among DLBA, Long Beach State University's Institute for Innovation & Entrepreneurship and F&M Bank. After an intensive business pitch session, three up-and-coming entrepreneurs were selected to receive grants totaling \$20,000 to fuel their small businesses.

Woman-Owned Business Accelerator (WOBA)

In its fourth year, the DLBA grant program enabled up to five women-owned businesses to share \$10,000 of funding provided by F&M Bank. Grant winners receive technical assistance and coaching from the Institute for Innovation & Entrepreneurship at California State University, Long Beach. For the second consecutive year, DTLB-based Fuller Management Corporation also offered full-service, customized, comprehensive business development and coaching to program participants.

To support Sarenity Floral, a new floral studio to teach in-person and online floral arrangement workshops and sell floral arrangements.



COMMITMENT TO OUR CLIENTS

Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loan Forgiveness

In 2020, the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) was rolled out to provide loans to help businesses keep their workforce during the COVID-19 crisis. A second round of PPP loans was authorized in January 2021 to provide ongoing support as the economy was still reeling from the effects of shutdowns, quarantines, and new social norms. With a 99% loan forgiveness rate, these funds came at a time when it was most needed for the businesses to survive while supporting over 118,000 local jobs. Our desire to serve our neighbors and community members who operate those businesses led to an effort that we are proud to look back on.

OPERATION S.A.F.E.

At F&M Bank, providing vital education to keep our clients' money safe is another way we strive to serve. According to the Federal Trade Commission, in 2021 consumers reported losing more than \$5.8 billion in fraud, an increase of more than 70 percent over the previous year. F&M Bank introduced Operation S.A.F.E. in 2020 to empower our clients with the knowledge and defense tactics they need to avoid falling victim to scams such as spoofing, phishing, and malware. Through education and communication we are following our founder's C.J. Walker's directive of safeguarding our clients' accounts to help our community thrive. In 2021, F&M was able to recover 97% of dollars that were subjected to fraud.
